Course Description:	The student will receive a hands-on clinical experience involving emergency and urgent care patients. The student will have the opportunity to complete history and physical examinations, assist in emergency procedures, and discuss treatment and disposition options with the supervisory physician. There will be weekly student didactic sessions. Interaction with residents.
Goals and Objectives:	By the end of the rotation, the student will: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Appropriately triage emergency department patients.• Diagnose and initiate treatment of common acute emergency and non-emergency conditions.• Formulate final disposition of patients, i.e., consult, admit, discharge, and referral.• Experience basic emergency department procedures including: venipuncture, NG and bladder catheterization, arterial punctures, and laceration repair.• Demonstrate basic procedural competency/understanding of airway management, wound care, chest tube insertion/central line placement in simulation mannequins.
