Therapies available at the Hamot Infusion Center

Therapies available at the Hamot Infusion Center include, but are not limited to:

- Medication administration (such as Remicade, Solumedrol, IVIG)
- Antibiotic therapy
- Injections (such as Lovenox, Avonex)
- Blood and blood product transfusions
- Hydration therapy
- Neupogen
- Inotropes
- Programming ambulatory infusion pumps
- Central line maintenance (such as Hickman catheters, PICC, vascular access ports)

Therapy times vary based on the treatment with duration ranging from 1 hour to 4 hours.

All therapies must be ordered by your physician.

Home Infusion Therapy

Should a patient's insurance provider not limit the delivery of infusion therapy to a hospital-based setting, traditional home care options are available through Great Lakes Home Healthcare Services.
